



Turget Uganda Internship Program:

The Short-term internship program offered through Turget Uganda is an inclusive program specifically designed to advance individual's knowledge of issues relating to gender and sexual reproductive health rights for vulnerable women, young people, and communities in Uganda. We can accommodate interested short-term participants for a period of 1-2 weeks. Longer-term internship opportunities for students fulfilling degree requirements, including research work, are also available for periods of several months.

A sample itinerary of Turget Uganda's short-term internship program includes the following:

This sample itinerary is not exhaustive. This program is tailored to suit the needs, expectations, and desires of each participant.

- Field visits to women's organizations and community empowerment groups throughout Uganda including the greater Kampala area. This permits one to learn about not just the problems, but the community-based responses and resiliency of women and young people. These field visits can be adjusted based on the interest of the participant but include access to field visits for Ugandan, refugee women populations, and other groups.
- Community events to hear testimonies of survivors of gender-based violence, testimonies on family planning and access to safe abortion services, and other gender and sexual reproductive health topics.
- Visits to community health providers to learn the challenges of women's medical care, including abortion access, family planning, menstrual health, and other topics.
- Opportunity to participate in a training workshop on menstrual health at Ugandan primary or secondary schools.
- Meetings with local Ugandan government officials such as the Local Council (LC1 is the community chairperson) to learn the structural difficulties to advance women's' rights. You will learn challenges and progress made.
- For individuals with an interest in the rights of gender and sexual minorities or the intersection of gender and disability, we have strong connection network to learn about the sensitivities of these issues.

- If you are conducting research, we have experience to work with visiting scholars from the United States and elsewhere, including that we have facilitated in contacts and setting a research program. This includes writing letters of introduction to NGOs, Government officials, and to academic institutions.
- We offer an introductory tour of the area where staying so the visitor can locate necessary services like banking, obtaining a Ugandan SIM card, locating supermarkets, shops, and the like.

Other Details:

Please note that Turget Uganda is sensitive to the needs of all travelers, particularly individuals that are travelling from outside of Uganda. Turget Uganda does not provide lodging at this time but can assist to make suitable recommendations for lodging based on the budget and requirements of interested individuals. Kampala offers a wide range of accommodations from budget hostels to Western-style motels. We can help arrange airport transfers or cultural tours and activities at an additional cost.
